## ORGANIZE LIKE A PRO

**Jeanie Engelbach**, founder of apartmentjeanie, tells *Star* how to master your mess.



**What's the first step in conquering clutter?**

Write out your top three priorities to help keep the work focused and targeted. Then, pick a date to work on your project. Lastly, set a time for you to accomplish the task and create realistic expectations as to how much you can achieve in that time allotment.

**How do you decide which items go vs. stay?**

With clothing and accessories, keep anything you love, looks and feels great on you and, to quote Marie Kondo, "brings joy." During the editing phase, I recommend making multiple piles: keep, toss, donate, give away and repair.

**What's a great storage hack for small accessories?**

If you think of your accessories as works of art, then consider hanging them within an empty ornate frame or in a shadow box. Using simple nails from the hardware store or upholstery nails are also easy ways to store jewelry.

**What about shoes?**

I favor clear plastic or clear drop-front shoe boxes for nonessential, out-of-season or special-occasion footwear. For everyday footwear, I prefer low shoe racks that can be easily tucked under hanging clothing.
